SUBJECT: GENERAL INFORMATION REGARDING THE QUANTITATIVE REASONING REQUIREMENTS

Students are required to take care of their “q” requirement by the end of their sophomore year. If you have an advisee who has not yet met her “q” requirement, please make sure she has plans to take care of this on schedule. If there is any question about a student’s “q” status, please be in touch with me and I can double-check their standing.

Any student signing up for a “Q” class must have met the “q” prerequisite. This can be met in one of three ways: (1) taking the placement test and being deemed “q-proficient,” (2) entering as a transfer student, completing the transfer module, and being deemed “q-proficient,” or (3) taking and passing a “q” class.

If there is a compelling reason that a student should take a “Q” class without having met her “q” prerequisite, she must meet with me to discuss the possibility of setting up a plan to meet both requirements concurrently. This will only be an option when (1) the “Q” class is not offered in a regular rotation, (2) it has been determined that the student has a reasonable expectation of passing the “q” course, and (3) the professor teaching the “Q” class agrees that this is an acceptable option for the student. An exception of this nature must be accompanied by signed paperwork.

Please remind your advisees of the services available at the QR Center for tutoring in “q” classes. We have a group of qualified tutors and a beautiful space on the first floor of the library in which to work.

For your reference, I have included, on the back of this sheet, a list of courses currently scheduled for this term that have the “Q” designation. Please do not hesitate to be in touch if you have any questions or concerns, and I will be glad to talk with you.
